Our sixth grade recognition ceremony will be Tuesday, May 25 at Walnut Hills. We wish our entire sixth grade graduates a big congratulations!!!

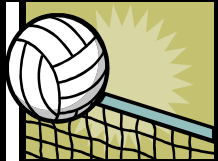
